

ORDINANCE NO. 16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BARSTOW FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF FEES TO COVER THE COST OF CERTAIN SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE DISTRICT.

Whereas; The Board of Directors of the Barstow Fire Protection District is empowered by the provisions of California State law, and the Uniform Fire Code, to impose reasonable fees, rates, and charges for municipal services; and

Whereas; The Board of Directors of the Barstow Fire Protection District has adopted Ordinance No. 13, providing for the establishment of reasonable fees, rates, and charges for municipal services; and,

Whereas; It is the intention of the Board of Directors of the Barstow Fire Protection District, that the fees established herein shall cover, but not exceed, the estimated reasonable cost of providing the service for which the fee is charged, except for such fees that may legally generate revenue; and,

Therefore; The Board of Directors of the Barstow Fire Protection District ORDAINS as follows:

That the Following Fee Schedule and Appendices are Hereby Authorized and Established.

And Be It Further Ordained; That Upon the Date Which This Ordinance Becomes Effective, Ordinance No. 13 is Hereby Repealed.

The Secretary Shall Cause This Ordinance to Be Published in Accordance with the Provisions of Current California State Law.

This Ordinance Shall Become Effective Thirty (30) Days from the Date of Adoption.

Validity. If any section, part, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance shall for any reason be declared invalid, such holding or holdings shall not effect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. It is the intent of the Board of Directors that it would have passed all other portions of this Ordinance independent of the elimination here from of any such portion as may be declared invalid.
